Introduction: School district operations will be implemented in the same manner as those in place prior to the pandemic; the exceptions will be fully described within this document. Palisades School District was open all year for in person instruction, for five days a week, during the 2020-2021 school year. This plan reflects those components we will keep in place to promote general health and safety for all students, employees and visitors as well as remaining compliant with national, state and local health quidance.

This plan will continue to be adapted as conditions change.

1. How will the LEA, to the greatest extent practicable, support prevention and mitigation policies in line with the most up-to-date guidance from the CDC for the reopening and operation of school facilities in order to continuously and safely open and operate schools for in-person learning?

This plan will continually be monitored to include updated CDC and Bucks County Department of Health (BCDH) recommendations. The plan will be reviewed and revised as necessary at the district level by the district's Health and Safety Planning team as well as the building level teams. The revisions will be recommended to the Board for approval and changes will be communicated to students, staff and the greater school community.

2. How will the LEA ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address the students' academic needs, and students' and staff members' social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services?

Our methods for educational delivery for the 2021-22 school year will be:

- 1. Instruction will resume on August 30, 2021 on a normal, Monday through Friday schedule.
- 2. The following options will be available to families:
 - a. Face to face, in classroom instruction
 - b. Online option (Palisades Cyber Academy) K-12; these are Palisades courses taught by Palisades teachers or vendor supported through Apex and K-12
 - c. Combination of face to face and cyber programming
 - d. Homeschool/face to face (this option has long been available to our homeschool families)

To adequately assess our staffing needs to provide these options, a survey was issued to parents/guardians who opted for a virtual setting in the previous school year or have newly registered

students to determine if their child(ren) will be joining us for face-to-face or online instruction for the upcoming school year.

Student medical issues which require a temporary leave from school will be addressed on a case by case basis to determine appropriate instructional alternatives to continue the student's education in consideration of information provided by the student's health care provider, parent/guardians, principal and counselor, and IEP team, if applicable.

To address the issue of mental health concerns for our students and staff, the following measures will be in place for the 2021-22 school year:

- 1. A licensed professional counselor (LPC), in addition to the 6 building school counselors, are available to provide mental health support for students and connect families with services
- 2. Staff will be routinely reminded of how to access the district Employee Assistance Program
- 3. Teacher support group developed last year will continue
- 4. Professional development options will continue that support mental health/stress reduction
- 5. Behavioral health supports will also be added through a Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA)

Universal and correct wearing of masks; 	Masking requirements while on school district property will continually be revised based on a variety of factors including: level of community transmission, vaccination levels, monitoring illness/clusters, if any, and updated guidance from national, state and local levels.
	As of Thursday, August 19, 2021, masks are required on buses due to the CDC order. Students will be required to wear masks on school buses until the CDC order expires. https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/travelers/face-masks-public-transportation.html
	2. The district will continue to adhere to the state masking mandate until the mandate expires.
	3. The day following the expiration of the state order, masks will be optional for students, employees and visitors in school buildings.
	4. Masks will be required in the event the Bucks County Department of Health has provided guidance to an individual, a classroom or building for TTM (targeted, temporary mitigation) in the event of an exposure or localized outbreak of COVID-19.
	An outbreak is defined as three (3) or more infectious cases of COVID-19 while at school, within a single classroom within five (5) days. The Bucks County Department

of Health will conduct case investigations and external contact tracing related to the outbreak. Palisades medical exemption process: Parent/guardian submits Palisades medical exemption form which includes consent to complete a 504 evaluation to determine student eligibility under the law. A parent/guardian may sign and submit this form without the child's medical provider's diagnosis, treatment plan, duration and signature; however, any information or evaluations regarding the student's diagnosis, treatment plan and duration that the parent is willing to provide will be considered during the course of the evaluation. b. Modifying Classroom configurations will promote learning and maximize distancing facilities to allow where feasible. for physical distancing (e.g., Elementary core content classes will remain self contained. Students will be taken outdoors as often as possible. use of Building faculty meetings, full administrative team meetings, and professional cohorts/podding); development activities will occur in person unless designated as virtual by the meeting coordinator. c. Handwashing General hand hygiene will be practiced throughout the day to minimize spread through use of common items. and respiratory Proper hand washing technique signs will be posted in all bathrooms and etiquette; sinks d.Cleaning and maintaining healthy All high-touch surfaces cleaned/disinfected by custodial crew daily (water fountains, door handles, desks, light switches, etc.) following posted facilities, including EPA/CDC/manufacturer guidelines. improving Clean desks on a frequent basis (soap and water for students/cleaning ventilation: solution for faculty/staff). Students and staff should sanitize/wash hands on a frequent basis. (Make hand sanitizer available in common areas, hallways, and/or in classrooms where sinks for handwashing are not available). PE equipment will be cleaned daily with Victory Sprayer. Water fountains will remain disconnected and faculty/staff and students are encouraged to bring water bottles from home and use filling stations. Personal cloth furniture and area rugs will remain out of the classrooms for an additional year to promote distancing in classrooms. Ventilate all classrooms and common areas when available/possible using windows. Use air circulation patterns that push inside air towards open windows. Doors and windows will be open to the maximum extent feasible (doors locked and propped in case we need to lockdown classrooms quickly) and ceiling fans will be operational to promote proper ventilation. Pedestal fans will be used in multipurpose rooms/gyms/cafeterias. If AC is running doors and windows will be closed. Exterior doors will remain locked. Quarterly filter changes will occur to maximize air flow

Updates will only occur on days in which school is in session. Cases reported on weekends or holidays will be included once school is back in session. Consult with the Bucks County Health Department on decisions impacting the closure of classrooms, schools, or the district due to an outbreak. Although the flu vaccine and COVID vaccine are not required for school attendance or employment, it is highly encouraged for all students and staff to get the flu vaccine and COVID vaccine. 		
f. <u>Diagnostic</u> and screening testing;	 Educate all stakeholders (students, staff, parents/guardians) on the signs and symptoms of COVID-19 at home before sending children to school and/or reporting to work. The nurse or designated employee will evaluate any individual who preser with symptoms and advise parents/guardians how to obtain a COVID test. No student will be tested without parental permission. School nurse medical record tracking system currently in place for student will be used to monitor. symptoms/exposure history for all employees including the tracking of vaccinations. Emergency contacts must be up to date. A symptomatic student must be picked up within an hour and will not be sent home on the bus. Until further notice, recognitions or awards for perfect attendance will not occur. Maintaining this recognition may encourage symptomatic students attend school. 		
g. Efforts to provide vaccinations to school communities;	 Continue to work with BCDH to provide opportunities for students and community members to receive vaccinations. No student will be vaccinated without parental permission. District communications vehicles will be used to distribute information regarding vaccination clinics and designated hours. 		
h. Appropriate accommodations for students with disabilities with respect to health and safety policies; and	 Director of Student Services, IEP case managers, school nurses, principals and counselors will work with families to develop a student-specific education plan for students with complex needs. The district will also collaborate with BCIU and other education providers to coordinate plans for students with complex needs. 		
i. Coordination with state and local health officials.	Regular communication will continue with the Bucks County Department of Health to confirm updated guidance from the CDC and other health officials.
